#### **Empowering children and young people to participate.**

Empowering children early has proven significant developmental benefits. The support provided to children and families by Investing In Our Youth sets them on a path to success. #### Embedding child safety at the heart of our organisation.

Investing In Our Youth is unwavering in its commitment to the safety, empowerment, and participation of all children, especially the most vulnerable. We maintain a zero-tolerance stance against any form of child abuse or exploitation, and have established robust policies and procedures to ensure the protection of program participants. This includes rigorous screening and background checks for individuals working with children and young people, alongside induction and training on our policies and reporting requirements.

Our approach involves proactive risk management and strict adherence to legal obligations for reporting concerns about child safety. We are dedicated to cultivating an inclusive environment that supports diversity, with particular attention to the cultural safety and empowerment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, and children with disabilities.

- A diverse range of parenting programs with excellent retention and attendance rates, supporting parents and caregivers, by enhancing their skills and engagement.
- Every child-focused program integrates skill development opportunities all five AEDC domains, offering holistic and varied opportunities to ensure smooth transitions into formal education.

#### **Child & Parent Centre - Collie Valley**

Supporting families in the Collie Valley, the Child & Parent Centre continue to expand our offerings, responding to community needs, through delivery of a variety of workshops and partnerships to families and children across the community. Our collaborative, partnership-focused team is dedicated to assisting the entire family unit, through parenting programs, inclusive playgroups that foster connection and a love of learning, access to children's health specialists and programs supporting the transition to school.

#### **Highlights include:**

• Partnering with multiple agencies to deliver high quality evidence based Circle of Security parenting program to the Collie Community.

• Prioritising opportunities for access to a wider range of services delivered in partnerships with ICAHMS, Anglicare WA and Relationships Australia from the Child and Parent Centre.

Engaging Collie Valley families and supporting them to be connected, active, and confident is at the heart of our service delivery, along with a strong emphasis on empowering children and parents for a positive and smooth transition to school that creates a life long love of learning.

Funded by the Department of Communities, IIOY and Milligan partnered to create Yallo; a vibrant community hub providing connection, education and activities for the Dalyellyup community. IIOY focus on providing activities, educational workshops and pop up play opportunities that support families with children in the early years.

Families have shared overwhelmingly positive feedback, highlighting the new friendships formed and the increased enthusiasm for outdoor play and reading at home. Encouraging connection and cultivating a community around family units is a key objective of Investing In Our Youth and our mission to improve family resilience.

#### **Highlights include:**

- Successful running of 'Bringing Up Great Kids' program which supports parents and caregivers in developing mindful, positive relationships with their children. We experienced a great retention rate and a lot of participants transitioned to our 'Bubs on Rugs' program to continue friendships and learning.
- Our outdoor play activities such as 'Storytelling in the Park' and 'Play Cafe for the Young and Old' have gained in popularity, extending through to the winter months. We regularly see over 30 families per session, with many families expressing their gratitude for the connection and learning.





# **Driving Programs**

Investing In Our Youth offers two driving programs across three locations throughout the South West. These programs play an integral part in helping young people meet the requirements for obtaining their driver's licence. Young people are granted the opportunity to gain vital driving experience and logged driving time under the guidance of volunteer driving mentors, service providers and support works with our Regional Young Driver Education (RYDE) program. The End to End Driver Training program is designed to support participants in their journey to achieving their full licence, from end to end, including pre-driver education, supervised driving hours and supports.

#### Highlights include:

- End to End Driver Training was nominated for Insurance Commission of Western Australia Regional Safety Award for the past three years and was winner in this category in 2024.
- Both driving programs have exceeded expectation with the volume of young people supported. Over 70 Young People actively participated in South West RYDE in 2024 and 104 successfully completed the full End to End Driver Training program.

#### **Blue Leaf**

Blue Leaf Initiative, funded by Healthways, is a youth mental health and wellbeing promotion project focusing on collaboration, connection and community. Blue Leaf Initiative has 4 pillars: Youth Safe (mental health training), Youth Aware (connecting young people to supports), Youth Empower (co-design with young people), and Youth Connect (inclusive social events).

Blue Leaf Initiative aims to foster connection among young adults, build social support networks, and prevent suicide through early intervention and training.

#### **Highlights include:**

- A variety of safe, inclusive and accessible events for people in Bunbury and Collie including games nights, walking groups, art and craft sessions, book clubs, yoga classes and more.
- Hosting Bunbury's Biggest Community Picnic for over 300 Southwest locals during Mental Health Week.
- Engaging young adults in a variety of volunteering opportunities to connect with others and contribute to their communities.

The reach of the Blue Leaf Initiative is growing and helping to improve mental health outcomes for young people across the Southwest.

The organisation is an income tax exempt charity and is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for Profits Commission. The organisation is registered for GST and ABN details are 26 472 921 505.
