The National Principles for Child Safe Organisations provide a consistent approach to embedding a child safe culture and practices in organisations.



1. Child Safety and wellbeing is in **organisational leadership, governance and culture.**



2. Children and young people are **informed** about their rights, and **actively participate** in decisions affecting them.



3. Families and communities are **informed** and **involved** in promoting child safety and wellbeing.



4. **Equity** is upheld and **diverse needs** respected in policy and practice.



5. People working with children and young people are **suitable** and **supported** to reflect child safety and wellbeing values in practice.



6. Processes to respond to **complaints** and **concerns** are child focused.



7. **Staff & volunteers** are equipped with the knowledge, skills and awareness to keep children and young people safe through **ongoing training** and **education.**



8. **Physical** and **online environments** promote safety and wellbeing while minimising the opportunity for children and young people to be harmed.



9. Implementation of the national child safe principles is **regularly reviewed** and **improved.**



10. **Policies** and **procedures** document how the organisation is safe for children and young people.

Empowering children and young people to participate.

Embedding child safety at the heart of our organisation.

Investing In Our Youth is unwavering in its commitment to the safety, empowerment, and participation of all children, especially the most vulnerable. We maintain a zero-tolerance stance against any form of child abuse or exploitation and have robust policies and procedures to ensure the protection of program participants. This includes rigorous screening and background checks for individuals working with children and young people, alongside induction and training on our policies and reporting requirements.

Our approach involves proactive risk management and strict adherence to legal obligations for reporting concerns about child safety. We are dedicated to cultivating an inclusive environment that supports diversity, with particular attention to the cultural safety and empowerment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, and children with disabilities.

Working collaboratively with others to foster partnerships.

Investing In Our Youth is fortunate to have a network of alliances who we collaborate and partner with to promote the healthy development of children, young people and families. Our funding bodies, community partners and individual supporters enable us to deliver high quality programs and services.



This inclusive partnership-based approach is a cornerstone of our organisation and allows us to maximise our reach and impact where it matters. The proven agility of our operations has supported our reputation as an organisation able to take action, facilitate connections and provide valuable local insights to inform program delivery.

Supporting families in the Collie Valley, the Child and Parent Centre continues to expand our offerings, responding to community needs, through delivery of a variety of workshops and partnerships to families and children across the community. Our collaborative, partnership-focused team is dedicated to assisting the entire family unit, through parenting programs, inclusive playgroups that foster connection and a love of learning, access to children's health specialists and programs supporting the transition to school.

Highlights include:

- Partnering with multiple agencies to deliver high quality evidence based parenting programs.
- Prioritising opportunities for access to a wider range of services including Child Health, ICAHMS, Anglicare WA and Relationships Australia 4Families from the Centre.

Engaging Collie families and supporting them to be connected, active, and confident is at the heart of our service delivery, along with a strong emphasis on empowering children and parents for a positive and smooth transition to school that creates a life long love of learning.

Yallo

Funded by the Department of Communities, IIOY offers the Yallo early years program; a vibrant community providing connection, education and activities for and in the Dalyellup community. IIOY focus on providing activities, educational workshops and pop up play opportunities that support families with children in the early years. Yallo also provides the ideal venue for Young Adult Games Nights, originally part of the Blue Leaf Initiative and now offered by Peppy Project.

Families have shared overwhelmingly positive feedback, highlighting the new friendships formed and the increased enthusiasm for outdoor play and reading at home. Encouraging connection and cultivating a community around family units is a key objective of Investing In Our Youth and our mission to improve family resilience.

Highlights include:

- 'Bubs on Rugs' program continues with good attendance and strengthens caregiver-baby social connections.
- Our outdoor play activity Little Chuditch Wonders continues to gain popularity and engagement with community.
- Play Cafe for Young and Old offered once a month all year round with indoor and outdoor options.
- Parenting programs are offered regularly with support from Parenting Connection WA.
- Young Adults Games Nights funded by Healthway and YACWA continue to engage those aged 18-25.

End to End Driver Training Program

Investing In Our Youth offers the End to End Driver Training program throughout the South West. This program plays an integral part in helping young people, and people over 25, meet the requirements for obtaining their driver's licence. The End to End Driver Training program is designed to support participants in their journey to achieving their full licence, from end to end, including pre-driver education, supervised driving hours and supports. The driving program is funded and supported by the Driving Access and Equity Program and Department of Justice.

Highlights include:

- End to End Driver Training Program were finalists in the Insurance Commission of Western Australia Regional Safety Award in 2022 and 2023 and won this category in 2024.
- Driver Mentor, Ken, won the SW Volunteer of the Year award in 2026.
- The Driving Program has exceeded expectations with the volume of participants supported and met its target for number of participants achieving their provisional licence.
- The Driving Program supports participants that identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (25%) and Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (7%).

The organisation is an income tax exempt charity and is registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for Profits Commission. The organisation is registered for GST and ABN details are 26 472 921 505.
